#### **MINISTER'S LETTER**

Dear Friends,

As I write this letter, I am looking out over the manse garden from my study, seeing butterflies for perhaps what seems to be the first time this year. Heidi, my wife, is very involved in nature as she looks after the "wild" nursery at Hordle school, which is based outside and looks at the world around us all year long as part of exploring early years learning with the pre-schoolers. This year we have not noticed butterflies until very recently.

Whilst this might seem alarming, what we have learnt over the last few years is that nature is not as predictable as we might think. For example, nature can produce an abundance of acorns one year, and then very few the next. This of course affects those pigs who are released for pannage, but also the food supplies for squirrels, and thus affects these populations the following year.

And, of course, humankind has an input into this more natural ebb and flow, with our choices on the environment affecting the climate, pollution and the availability of flowers and plants that support wildlife.

This, for me reflects our relationship with God.

God, our creator has offered us the world to use as a resource, but to do so sensibly. Part of this is as simple as using up the resources that God provides, but it also reflects the fact that perhaps we are not all of creation that God is concerned with.

The whole universe is part of God's plan, and sometimes we can be drawn into thinking that it might just be our planet, our community, or even just ourselves.

This wide-reaching plan is obviously a bit of a mystery – it has to be as it is so far reaching we could not ever consider it in its entirety, but God does reveal clues, and is always there throughout any changes that might be taking place around us.

As I joined as "interim" minister, I am aware that you have been through a lot of changes in a relatively short space of time, and this is one of the reasons my role is specifically defined as an "interim" minister.

Together with the elders, I will work to try and determine where Lymington URC might be right now, and what that might mean for the future – of course centred around prayer and discernment.

This does mean my role might not look like a "traditional" ministers role, and of course my time is limited to 25% with you, but this does not mean that I will not be working out a schedule that means that I am available at the church regularly, leading worship at least once a month from October onwards, and hopefully getting to know you all over the next few months.

I also recognise that you may not know me so well either, so I

will ask the elders to circulate my latest "profile", which offers you an overview of myself, my family and my ministry to date.

#### THE LAKES OF KILLARNEY, IRELAND


#### Verse 2

The purple heather mountain,
The river running by,
The sunset and the morning,
That brightens up the sky:

Cecil Frances Alexander 1818-1895, who wrote this hymn, visited Killarney in Southern Ireland where I was brought up. Her husband was the Anglican Primate for Ireland. The lakes of Killarney are surrounded by mountains and one of them is called The Purple Mountain. My father had a boat and as children we went out for picnics on the various islands and we regularly sang this hymn whilst in the boat. I often changed the wording of the 2nd verse to include the names of the many islands on the lakes. The sunrises and sunsets are very spectacular. So as you can imagine, whenever we sing this hymn, the words remind me of Killarney.

One of my favourite hobbies is watching and identifying bugs and bees, probably not everyone's favourite hobby? However now that Spring is on its way perhaps some of you have noticed the Dark Edged Bee-fly (Bombylius major) enjoying itself in your garden? It likes low growing flowers, particularly Primroses, Pulmonaria & Bugle. They fly around the garden often in small groups making a loud buzzing noise and trailing their long legs behind.




